One of the things I am so grateful for is that I, and the residents can meet each week on each of the units to hold a post-covid church service. Since we can also sit a little closer to one another, it has allowed for a sense of community to grow among the residents which is evident in what they now share in our time together. Initially, prayer requests were for their health, the health and safety of their families and occasionally a request for travelling mercies for a family or friend.

Lately the residents' prayer requests have grown to include their struggles of faith, questions as to why they remain on the earth when they would prefer to be in heaven, mental health challenges like depression, anxiety, inability to sleep well and even challenges that members of their families are dealing with – like divorce, loss of income and conflicts of various kinds. The questions they ask during the service are evidence of a deep sense of community that has grown where there is safety and space to ask hard questions.

This past week one of the residents mentioned how hard life is and that all they want to do is leave the earth and be in heaven. They asked why God would not answer their plea to leave the earth and could I please explain why God was withholding this request of theirs. This question led all of us in the service to have a good conversation about God and how, when, or if He answers our pleas and prayers.

Music is a huge component of the church services here at Donwood Manor, and we usually sing at least five songs together and if time allows, a sixth one. After the service I often hold an informal hymn singing time with any residents that would like to stay and sing some more. It is so encouraging to have many residents join in the singing not only during the service but after as well.

Last week a resident who had been bedridden for some time was able to join the service in their new and lovely wheelchair. This resident is mostly non-verbal but once we started singing they became verbal and sang along with almost every hymn in the service. After service they stayed for the informal singing time and sang as many hymns as they could. It was so incredibly encouraging and satisfying that the gift of music was one they could enjoy and allowed them to express themselves! I caught myself crying while watching them sing!

I am grateful that at Donwood Manor there is a priority on having faith community time together that allows for difficult conversations, to have a safe place, and allows residents to experience joy while singing their hearts out!

Thankfully a long-time challenge in the auditorium has been resolved. We now have assisted hearing devices for any tenant who needs one! These devices are being put to good use in the Donwood Manor EPH!

Every week tenants are finding how lovely it is to hear the speakers, whether during Sunday church service, in German Bible Study with chaplain Gerhard Friesen or in English Bible Study with chaplain Wanda Derksen. The devices are used for other group settings in the auditorium as well, including biweekly communion services and special events or programs.

The assisted hearing devices are kept charged and ready to use for any given program that is held in the auditorium. Each device has a headset and a monitor. Each tenant can set the volume to the level that they need. There are a total of 50 devices that can be used and half of them have tenants' names on them! The other monitors are available whenever needed.

The group events and services are much appreciated and well attended by those living in the Donwood Manor EPH. The weekly Bible Studies and Church services have attendance between twenty and thirty for each service and growing due to access to this technology.

We are so grateful for the Donwood Foundation's support in enhancing the life of those entrusted to our care.
